- The Duke of Edinburgh's Award is widely recognised and respected worldwide and is open to young people aged between 14 and 24.
- In the 2017/17 school year students in Year 10 have the opportunity to gain the DofE Bronze Award, the first step on this journey.
- The aim is for up to 35 x Yr 10 students to work towards the award this school year.

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The Duke of Edinburgh's Award at Bronze consists of 4 sections, all to be completed in your own time, outside of school hours:

1. Volunteering

One of these must be done for 6 months, the others for 3 months, each for an average of 1 hour per week.

2. Physical

3. Skills

Activity ideas are on the DofE website.

4. Expedition

On successful completion of 1, 2 and 3 you will train for, plan and take part in two 2-day, 1 night expeditions, one as practice and one assessed.



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What you will get out of the experience:

- Increased self-belief & self-confidence
- A sense of identity
- A sense of responsibility
- A real awareness of your strengths
- New talents and abilities
- The ability to plan and use time
- The ability to learn from and give to others in the community
- New friendships
- Improved problem solving, presentation and communication skills
- Enhanced leadership and team working skills



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What does it cost:

- £50 initial fee at the time of registration.
- Possible, but unlikely, further costs for the expedition phase to cover equipment hire, campsite fees, etc.
- We have some outdoor equipment available to hire for the expedition phase for a small fee.
- The cost of the skills and physical activities are your responsibility, if you choose skydiving it will be more expensive than swimming.
