#### Year 12

This unit will develop your knowledge and understanding of fundamental musical theory and how it's applied in practical musical activities.

.Unit 3: Ensemble (Core) – Learners work as part of a musical ensemble and develop their skills and techniques in rehearsal and performance

#### <u>Year 13</u>

**Unit 2: The Music Industry (Core)** – Learners explore what it is that makes someone a professional in the music industry and how to put forward a bid for work.

**Unit 5: Session Musician** – In this unit, you will explore a range of genres and styles, investigating their scales, tonality, rhythms, riffs and groove. It will give you greater insight into the skills and knowledge needed to be a working session musician.
