### We offer an extensive curriculum which is personalised to the individual needs of our students.

The Level 3 courses we offer will ensure students have access to subjects that interest them, offer a pathway from Key Stage 4, while providing the required combinations to gain a place at university or an apprenticeship. Each type of course offers something different to the student. It is important that these are taken into consideration when making option choices.

#### Advanced Level courses (A Levels)

These courses are studied for two years and are examined at the end of Year 13.

#### Level 3 Applied BTEC courses

These courses are also studied over two years. Applied BTEC courses suit students who might prefer a different mode of assessment as most still have a greater element of coursework alongside exams.

Entrance to the Sixth Form is determined by pathways; A Level Pathway, Applied A Level Pathway and Applied BTEC Pathway.

#### **Entry Requirements**

In order to join our Sixth Form a student will be expected to gain an average GCSE point score of 4.0 or above. Students will then be assigned a pathway which will allow them to choose their courses. Information for this can be found in our application pack.

## Student SUPPORT and Tutor PROGRAMME

A successful sixth form is measured in many different ways, not least in the support and guidance it provides for those within its care.

#### Student support

Whatever students plan to study at Sixth Form, they will have access to one-to-one support from experienced staff throughout their course. This will include tutor support, academic mentoring, study skills sessions, support with revision, career planning, financial advice and health and welfare – everything they will need to be successful in Sixth Form and beyond. The Sixth Form pastoral team is also available throughout the day ensuring there is always someone there to help.

#### **Tutor programme**

The pastoral system plays a key role in the support of students' pastoral and academic progress. Students are placed in tutor groups led by one of our specialist Sixth Form tutors.

Weekly tutorial sessions support students with university destinations, mental health and current affairs and run alongside one-to-one bespoke mentoring meetings. This programme is designed to offer additional layers of support to students. Weekly assemblies also support the development of personal skills, social skills and methodical skills which equip students to be successful learners.

A school is more than a set of buildings and resources. However, we're very proud of the first class facilities which complement our Sixth Form provision.

Our Sixth Form has been designed with the demands of post-16 education at its core. The Sixth Form building, which has sole use by the Sixth Form students, has excellent computers, a large quiet study area and two small conference teaching rooms. The building is also supported by a wireless network which students can use for their study. All of this combines to allow students to work independently and use their time effectively.

When students are working so hard, we recognise the need for them to relax and socialise. There is a Sixth Form refectory with a common room for this purpose. This is open most of the day offering fresh coffee, soft drinks, snacks and lunch.

## Enrichment and **GUIDANCE**

Our Sixth Form aims to be the perfect stepping stone from school to university or employment and the complexities of a challenging wider world.

In order to develop our students socially and academically there is an extensive programme of enrichment. This aims to develop skills outside of the class room as well as give our students the opportunity to stand out in a workplace situation.

Enrichment takes place on a Wednesday afternoon and involves a variety of external speakers, visits to universities, skills building sessions as well as social opportunities. Applying to competitive courses or apprenticeships requires a good knowledge of the work place. Therefore, enrichment time is also used as a time to provide work experience. To support this we have arranged a wide range of work experience including hospitals, schools and Gloucester Rugby Club.
