



## The Use of the 16 to 19 tuition fund at Churchdown School.

The 16 to 19 tuition fund is £96 million of one-off funding for the 2020 to 2021 academic year only, issued by the ESFA to all schools. At Churchdown the funding is ring fenced to mitigate the disruption to learning arising from coronavirus (COVID-19) of the 16 -19 students.

The funding allocation for Churchdown School was £8567. This amount has been allocated as a result of measuring the potential need of our disadvantaged students and learners with low prior attainment; meaning those who did not achieve a grade 4 or above in English and/or Maths.

The funding has been provided to support small group tuition for 16 to 19 students in English, Maths, and other courses where learning has been disrupted. Therefore, our funding allocation has been used to address the context that best meets the needs of our students. All supported students who have benefited from the funding allocation are on a 16 to 19 study programme and we have considered what will be most effective intervention for our students, considering students' needs and local circumstances. Below is a summary of the interventions planned for in 2020 – 2021:

Strategies	Amount Spent	What is the specific provision?
Online Learning Subscriptions	£2400	Students who have needed additional online support materials or access to programmes are given this additional provision. The support materials and programmes are those that are not included in our school's current suite. Examples include Seneca Learning and Kaboodle to support the learning in a range of subjects.
Specialist (SLSA)	£5500	Students with SEND have been prioritised to receive 1:1 or small group support via Teams or in person in school. The support was not focussed on the delivery of their lessons and learning materials, but to ensure the access to the materials and understanding by the students was secure.
Additional home visits to support home learning	£400	In addition to the home visits already in place for our vulnerable students, we also provided home visits for our 16 – 19 students where pastoral leaders have identified them as struggling to work effectively remotely. The purpose of the home visit was to ascertain if any additional support was needed so to ensure no gaps in learning occurred. Our Director of Pupil Premium achievement was also heavily involved to ensure all PP students accessed the right support.
Careers Guidance	£350	To ensure students had a clear pathway to the next stage of their education, we deployed a careers advisor to speak with relevant students about their next steps. The purpose of this was to ensure all students had a plan for life after Churchdown and so remain motivated and engaged with their learning as well as ready to graduate successfully from Churchdown. Subject leaders were also involved in this process so relevant learning provision can be deployed to benefit all students exact needs.
